Just a little note to say, "Thank You" with this red carnation that symbolizes "The Doctors' Day" on March 30th of every year. On behalf of the Medical Society of The County of King's, I want to convey my Heartfelt thanks and show our appreciation to all of you.

There can never ever be a tangible remuneration to adequately compensate you, for your dedication and the sacrifices you make fulfilling your calling to serve humanity with your hard work, experiencing stress, often loneliness in demanding situations and burnout due to ever increasing regulatory burdens and tyranny of the insurance carriers. I thank you for being here with your family, friends, and your colleagues to celebrate and to honor some of your distinguished colleagues. My congratulations to all the honorees. Each one of you deserves a great big standing ovation.



A little bit of history to help recapitulate. Doctors' Day first started on March 30th1933 and has been celebrated every year ever since. Eudora Brown Almond, the wife of a surgeon in Winder, Georgia, believed that her husband and his colleagues deserved better recognition for their hard work. She decided to make it a reality. Along

with other wives, she celebrated the first Doctors' Day. The date selected for this celebration was the day when general anesthesia was first used in surgery. That was 91 years after the first anniversary of Dr. Crawford Williamson Long's remarkable discovery of Diethyl Ether as a general anesthetic on March 30,1842 to remove a mass from his patient's neck.

On October 30,1990, George W. Bush signed the declaration of "The Doctors' Day" with approval from both Houses of Congress. Crawford W. Long memorial Hospital later got incorporated into Emory University Hospital.

Statistically, this room is full of physicians who have improved the lives of hundreds of thousands of people in Brooklyn over half a century.

Statistics are dry. Let me translate it into the universal language of life.

You have shared the joys of parents bringing tens of thousands of new lives in this world. You have been superheroes to mothers and fathers when you have given your all to save tiniest of newborns. You have been there to tend to kids' strep throats and mend blocked and leaky hearts of their parents. You are there to comfort those who

were in the twilight of their lives. And you are there together with family to mourn those who departed to join other heavenly stars.

I congratulate today's honorees and all physicians for their dedication to our noble profession.

Doctors' Day

March 30 is Doctors' Day, an annual observance aimed at appreciating physicians who help save our lives everywhere. The holiday first started in 1933 in Winder, Georgia, and since then it's been honored every year on March 30 which was the first anniversary of a doctor using ether anesthesia by Dr. Crawford W. Long (March 30, 1842). Today we continue to celebrate medical advances like these and thank all doctors everywhere who've spent so much time and energy mastering their field of expertise.

History of Doctors' Day

Eudora Brown Almond, the wife of a doctor in Georgia, believed her husband and other physicians deserved more recognition for their hard work and set out to make this idea a reality. The first observed Doctors' Day occurred on March 30, 1933, exactly 91 years after Dr. Long's remarkable discovery.

Almond mailed greeting cards to all local physicians and their wives, and she put flowers on the graves of deceased doctors, including Dr. Long. The flowers were red carnations, which would later become the representative flower for the national holiday. A few other local doctors' wives even assisted Almond in preparing a celebratory luncheon so their husbands' work in healthcare could be publicly appreciated.

The tradition of delivering greeting cards to physicians, both alive and dead, has continued throughout the years and is still a common way of celebrating this holiday today. The red carnation is also still popularly used to say "thank you" to doctors for their work in medicine.

Doctors' Day was unofficially celebrated for many years before it became a legal holiday. Finally, the U.S. House of Representatives adopted a resolution that commemorates Doctors' Day and on October 30, 1990, George W. Bush signed the legislation after approval from both the House and the Senate.



Dr. Jeffrey J. Basti has over thirty-five years of medical experience including twenty-five years as Chief



of Critical Care at Lutheran Medical Center in Brooklyn. Since last ten years, he serves as one of the Vice Chairs of Medicine at Maimonides Medical Center. His expertise included overseeing the Simulation Lab and multiple Primary Care clinics which serve the Brooklyn community – being responsible for the twenty Attending Physicians across each site. He is board certified in Internal Medicine, and Pulmonary & Critical Care.

Dr. Basti is a Police Surgeon for the NYPD for nine years. He supervised twenty-four staff members at the Candidate Assessment Division, overseeing all

the uniformed and civilian physical examinations and medical record reviews.

In May 2023, Dr. Basti was promoted to Deputy Chief Surgeon, Medical Director in charge of Medical Services performing annual and incident-related evaluations of SCUBA teams from Harbor Unit. He also performs medical evaluation for Emergency Services Unit and Medical Division Paramedics.



Honoree Federico Gattorno, MD

Federico Gattorno was born in Cuba and is the oldest of three children. His family fled Cuba in the



1960's to Venezuela. The family settled in Barquisimeto, Venezuela where he went to school in La Salle. As a child, he was a music lover, specifically classical music. Because of his love for music he studied and became a classical pianist. When Dr. Christiaan Barnard and his team performed the first heart transplant in 1967, Dr. Gattorno decided that surgical medicine was the career path he would choose. When his father learned of his decision, he mobilized a makeshift operating room in the garage where he and three classmates practiced performing appendectomies on rabbits. All three are physicians today. In addition, he became a composer where he went on to composed music for various telenovelas (soap operas) and TV shows in Venezuela. He won an award for the soundtrack music for the film Jerico and won First Prize for a song in a Music Festival in Caracas. Dr. Gattorno was the host of a weekly television show called Clasicos Dominicales. His heart however, belonged to medicine. Through his work on television and radio,

he was able to put himself through school. He also worked as a Surgical scrub technician to pay his expenses. He spent long hours working and studying, some times getting 3 hours of sleep a day to be able to fulfill his work and education obligations. But, with his hard work, he was able to graduate as a surgeon at the University Hospital in Caracas Venezuela in1995. In 1997 he completed a Fellowship in Laparoscopic Surgery at Mount Sinai Hospital New York (one of the first Minimally Invasive Surgery fellowships in the US).

He returned to Venezuela to continue practicing and became the Director and founder of UNIQA advance surgical unit at Hospital Urologico de San Roman, from 1998 to 2007. Dr. Gattorno made the difficult decision to leave his home and left his career behind in Venezuela and came to New York City. While wating for his medical license in New York State, he was Professor at New York Podiatry School of Medicine and at Touro College of Medicine. He came to Woodhull as a Special Fellow in 2010, then moved up to become a Surgical Attending in 2013 performing minimally invasive procedures, teaching and mentoring Medical students and Surgery Residents rotating thorugh Woodhull. Dr. Gattorno was named teaching attending of the Year in 2019 and in 2021 by the Harlem Hospital-Columbia University General Surgery Residency Program.

Dr. Gattorno has published and presented more than 90 papers, including scientific videos and few book chapters and has lectured at more than 80 international conferences. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeon, former President of the Venezuelan Chapter; a proud member of SAG-ES; Reviewer editor for Surgical Endoscopy Journal.

Outside of his work as a surgeon, Dr. Gattorno is happily married to his husband Jhoel and enjoys the opera, classical music, traveling and cooking.




